Our local South Florida Council impacts more than **20,000 local youth** through the efforts of nearly **1,400 trained volunteers** who share their time, talent, and resources. Under the leadership of a volunteer board made up of top business and community leaders, the South Florida Council exceeds standards for non-profits in programmatic and financial strength. 2021 through 2024 has demonstrated the increasing demand for programs with membership growing each year, totaling + 47.8% more youth served.

Scouting comes alive when young people experience the adventure of camping in the great outdoors. The South Florida Council owns and operates three camping facilities.

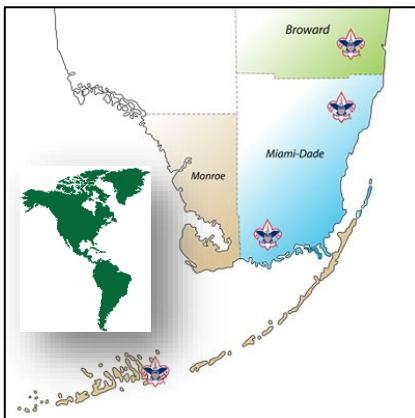
Camp Elmore, in Davie, a 117-acre camp providing weekend and summer programs for more than 10,000 Scouts, siblings, and parents annually.

Tatham Scout Service Center, located at Camp Elmore in Davie is home to the South Florida Council's headquarters office for accounting, registration, Eagle Scout processing, membership and Scout group support.

37 Degrees North - (Miami Scout Shop), located in Miami Lakes, a one-stop outfitter shop for our Scout groups to get their advancement, literature, uniforms, camping gear, and more! Open online and every day of the week on beautiful Main Street in Miami Lakes. Serves all counties!

Camp Everglades, within Everglades National Park, Homestead, is a 217-acre tropical preserve providing a rustic setting for camping and training sessions for Scout groups. Facilities include shelters, restroom, water, and a kitchen.

Camp Sawyer, Edward B. Knight Scout Reservation, the Florida Keys, is a 9-acre ocean front facility flanked between the Florida Bay and the Atlantic Ocean on Scout Key and offers camping and aquatic activities for more than 3,500 Scouts and families annually. Swimming, kayaking, fishing, and a great base camp for Florida Keys adventures.
